1.2.2 Powering on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Swipe, PIN, Password or Pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or forget it, contact your network carrier. Be sure to keep your PIN code safe.

1.2.3 Powering off your phone

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, long press 1.

If you receive a voicemail, \mathbf{OO} appears on the status bar. Open the notification panel and touch New voicemail.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



End the current call.



X

Touch once to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.

Touch once to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.

- Display the dial pad.
- П

Touch once to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.

More options.



To avoid accidental operation of the touchscreen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the phone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the phone is taken away from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the contact name or number to switch between two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch 🚦 and select Add call to add another call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch (). You can also add participants from Call log or Contacts.
- Touch 🚦 and select Merge calls to start the conference call.
- Touch 💽 to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

Touch from the **Call** screen, then touch **Settings**. The following options are available:

Display options

- Sort by: Touch to sort the list by the first name or last name.
- ⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network carrier.

• Name format: Touch to choose whether to display first name first, or last name first.

Sounds and vibration

Touch to set incoming call ringtone, and mark the checkbox to enable dial pad tones or vibrate for calls.

Quick responses

Touch to edit the quick responses which can be used when you reject a call with a message.

Calls

- Call settings: Touch your carrier name under Calling accounts to open the following call settings:
 - Voicemail

Service: Opens a dialog box where you can select your carrier's voicemail service or another service.

Setup: If you are using your carrier's voicemail service, this opens a dialog box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail.

Sound: Touch to set the sound when a new voicemail arrives.

Vibrate: Mark the checkbox to enable vibration when a new voicemail arrives.

- Fixed dialing numbers

Fixed Dialing number (FDN) is a SIM service mode, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers to which their children can dial. For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

- Call forwarding

Touch to configure how your calls are forwarded when your phone is busy, unanswered or unreachable.

- Call barring

Touch to configure call barring settings. Mark the checkbox to activate call barring for outgoing and incoming calls.

- Additional settings

 $\mbox{Caller ID:}$ Your phone will use default carrier settings to display your number in outgoing calls.

 $\ensuremath{\text{Call waiting:}}$ Mark the checkbox to notify you during a call of a new incoming call.

3.2 Call log

You can access your call log by touching O from the **Call** screen to view missed calls, outgoing calls and incoming calls.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations, you can launch a new call, send SMS to the contact or number, view detailed information of the call, or clear the call.

Touch **View full call history** to view all call logs. Touch **and Clear call history** to clear the entire call history.

3.3 Contacts.....

- 1

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{Contacts}}$ enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize them with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

3.3.1 Consult your Contacts

To see your contacts, touch 🔝 from the app list.



Delete a contact

Long press the contact you want to delete until of appears in place of the contact photo, then touch and select **Delete**.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

Touch to display the contacts list option menu. The following actions are available:

- Contacts to Choose contacts to display.
- Import/export Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, microSD card and phone storage, etc.
- Groups View or create contact groups.
- Manage accounts Manage the synchronisation settings for different accounts.
- Settings Touch to change the display of the sort list and contact names.
- Blocked numbers Touch to view your blocked contacts. You can also unblock them.

3.3.2 Adding a contact

Touch 💽 in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.



When finished, touch 🗸 to save.

Add to/Remove from Favorites (1)

To add a contact to favorites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch $\stackrel{\bullet}{\longrightarrow}$ to add the contact to favorites.

To remove a contact from favorites, touch the star \bigstar on the contact details screen.

3.3.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch 🧪 in the contact details screen.

When finished, touch \checkmark to save.

Change a contact's default phone number

You can set the default phone number for a contact with more than one number.

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, long press the desired number, and select **Set default**. Then **L** will appear ahead of the number.

3.3.4 Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact to open Quick contact for Android. You can then touch $\$ or the number to make a call. To send a message, touch \blacksquare .



The icons available on the Quick contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

3.3.5 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

This phone enables you to import or export contacts between your phone, SIM card and phone storage.

¹⁾ Only phone contacts can be added to Favorites.

From the Contacts screen, touch to open the options menu. Touch **Import/export**, then select to import/export contacts from/to your accounts, SIM card, Phone, internal storage, micro SD card, etc.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch the contact you want to share, touch and **Share** from the contact details screen. Select the number you want to share , and then select the application to perform this action.

3.3.6 Displaying contacts

You can configure which list of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch and touch **Contacts to display** from contacts list screen. You can then choose which contacts to display.

Touch and Settings to sort the list by touching First name or Last name, as well as viewing contact names by touching First name first or Last name first.

3.3.7 Merging/Separating contacts

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch so to enter the edit contact screen, then touch again and touch Merge contacts.

You then need to select the contact whose information you want to merge with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one,and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list. To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch to enter the edit contact screen, then touch again and touch **Unlink**. Touch **UNLINK** to confirm.

3.3.8 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch from the contacts list and touch Accounts > Add account, or from the Home screen, touch (), then Settings > Accounts > Add account.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account setups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Touch the account you want to delete > Touch > Select **Remove account** > Confirm.

Auto-sync

On the **Accounts** screen, touch and mark the **Auto-sync data** checkbox. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized with each other.

4 Messaging and Email.....

4.1 Messaging.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

To send a message, touch

4.1.1 Write a new message

On the message list screen, touch 🛋 to write text/multimedia messages.



Sending a text message

An SMS message of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. There is a counter on the right of the text box to remind you how many characters are allowed to be entered in one message.



Specific letters (accented) will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible mobiles and email addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **Enter name or number** bar. Touch the **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message.

Touch 💿 to attach a picture, video, audio, etc.

When finished, touch \geq to send the multimedia message.

4.1.2 Manage messages

When receiving a message, will appear on the status bar as a notification. Drag down the status bar to open the notification panel, touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and touch the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as conversation.

Touch a message to enter the message composing screen:

- Touch 📞 to call the number;
- Touch and then Add to contacts to save the number to contacts; or touch **E** to view the contact details if the number has been saved;

- To reply to a message, enter the text. When finished, touch ≽
- Long press a message to display the following options: copy text, forward, delete, select all, etc..

4.1.3 Adjust message settings

On the message list screen, touch § and select **Settings**.

Text message (SMS)

- Request delivery Mark the checkbox to request a delivery report for each text message you send.
- Manage SIM card Touch to manage text messages stored on your messages SIM card.
- Edit quick text Touch to add or edit message templates.
- SMS service Opens a popup to show the service center number.
- SMS validity period. Select a validity period, during which the network provider will continue to resend the message if not immediately deliverable.
- SMS storage Select your phone or SIM card as SMS storage location.
- Character code Touch to set the message encode format.

Multimedia message (MMS)

- Group messaging Select to enabled, you will be able to send a single message to multiple recipients.
- Request delivery Select to request a delivery report for each multimedia message you send.
- Request read Select to request a report on whether each recipient has read a multimedia message sent by you.
- Send read report Select to automatically send a read report to the sender if he/she has requested.
- Auto-retrieve Select to automatically download the whole MMS message (including message body and attachment) to your phone. To download only the MMS message header, unmark the checkbox.
- Roaming autoretrieve Mark the checkbox to enable auto-retrive when roaming.

Notifications

- Message Select to display message notifications in the status bar.
- Mute Select to mute notifications, or set a schedule for when to mute.
- Sound Select a ringtone as new messages notification tone.
- Vibrate Select to vibrate when notifications are received..

General

- Message font Select a message font size. size
- Delete old Will delete old messages when maximum number of stored messages is reached. To enable the function, mark the checkbox.
- Cell Broadcast Mark/unmark the checkbox to enable/disable cell Broadcast ringtone.
- Select Cell Select a ringtone for Cell Broadcast messages. .
 Broadcast
 ringtone
- Cell Broadcast Enable or disable the receipt of Cell Broadcast messages.

• Enable WAP Mark/unmark the checkbox to enable/disable PUSH receipt of push messages from network.

4.2 Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing $\ensuremath{\mathsf{E}}\xspace$ mail .

You can also set up external POP3 or IMAP email accounts in your phone.

To set up your email account, touch () from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email setup wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter the email address of the account you want to set up.
- Touch NEXT. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. You can also touch MANUAL SETUP to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- Enter your password.
- Finish by setting up your account settings for synchronising frequency, notification, etc.
- Edit your account name if necessary.

To add another email account, you can touch the \equiv icon and then Settings. Touch Add account to create.

To create and send emails

- Touch the 💽 icon from the inbox screen.
- \bullet Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field.

- \bullet If necessary, touch the Add Cc/Bcc menu icon \checkmark to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch 📼 to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch ≽ to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch the
 icon and select Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy.
 To view the draft, touch
 to display all labels, then select Drafts.
- If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch the icon and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch the \equiv icon from the inbox screen and then touch **Settings**, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

5 Calendar, Clock, and Calculator.....

You can use **Calendar** to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, touch () from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar by Schedule, Day, 3-day, Week, or Month.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All-day.**
- Invite people to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you want to invite with commas to separate. The guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- \bullet When finished, touch $\ensuremath{\mathsf{SAVE}}$ from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Week view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area which will then turn +, then touch **the icon** to create the new event.

Before you can add an event, you must add at least one Calendar account and make a calendar visible.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen, touch it to edit the event, or touch i and select **Delete** to delete.

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon an will appear on the status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the notification panel, touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch the $\ensuremath{\text{Back}}$ button to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the notification panel.

5.2 Clock

Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To view the current time, touch $\textcircled{\mbox{\footnotesize m}}$ from the Home screen, then touch $\fbox{\mbox{Clock}}.$

5.2.1 World clock

To view the world clock, touch ${igodot}$ on the Time screen.

Touch 🛞 to add a time zone.

5.2.2 Alarm

From the Time screen, touch 0 to enter the Alarm screen.

Turn on () to enable the alarm.

- Touch 🕀 to add a new alarm, the following options will appear:
- Time Touch to set the alarm time.
- Repeat Touch to select the days when you want the alarm to work.
- Ringtone Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- Vibrate Select to activate vibration.
- Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.

Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.

Touch \checkmark and then \blacksquare to delete the selected alarm.

5.2.3 Countdown

From the Time screen, touch \sum to enter the **Countdown** screen.

- Enter the time. The time should be typed in second, minute and hour number sequence.
- Touch 💽 to start the countdown.
- Touch X+ to set the countdown time in panel.
- Touch 🕕 to pause the countdown.
- Touch 👕 to delete current countdown label.

5.2.4 Timer

From the Time screen, touch $\overline{\bigcirc}$ to enter the Timer screen.

- Touch 💽 to start the timer.
- Touch 🕐 to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- Touch (1) to halt the total and lap times. These will only restart after is touched.
- \bullet Touch \checkmark to delete the record.
- Touch < to share.

5.2.5 Adjust Clock settings

Touch and then **Settings** to adjust the following options:

Clock

- Style Touch to set the clock style to analogue or digital.
 Automatic home clock Mark the checkbox to add a clock for your Home time zone when travelling in an area where the time is different.
- Home time zone Touch to set Home time zone.

Alarms

- Silence after Touch to set a temporary turn off time for an alarm.
- Snooze length Touch to set the duration of alarms.
- Alarm volume Touch to set alarm volume.
- Volume buttons Touch to set Volume key behaviour when alarm sounds: Do nothing, Snooze or Dismiss.
- Start week on Touch to choose the start of a week.

5.3 Calculator.....

To use the calculator, touch $\textcircled{\ensuremath{\textcircled{}}}$ from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\mbox{Calculator}}$.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two ways:

• Swipe the basic calculation screen to the left to open the scientific calculation.

Or turn the phone to the landscape orientation from the basic panel to open the scientific calculation. This option only available if **Settings** > **Display** > **When device is rotated** > **Rotate the contents on screen** is on.



Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed. Enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch \times to delete digits one by one, long press \times to delete all at once.

6 Getting connected

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/ EDGE/3G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

6.1 Connecting to the internet

6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G

The first time you turn on your phone with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: GPRS, EDGE , 3G .

If the network is not connected, you can turn on mobile data in Settings > Data usage.

To check the network connection you are using, touch **Settings > More >** Cellular networks > Access point names or Network carriers.

To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Touch Settings > More > Cellular networks > Access point names.
- \bullet To enter the required APN information, touch $\buildrel >$ and then $\buildrel \oplus$
- When finished, touch 🖡 and then Save.

To enable data roaming

- Touch Settings > More > Cellular networks.
- Touch Data roaming and choose Roaming modes(optional): Disable, National roaming only, All networks.
- When data roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi").

To set preferred network type

• Touch Settings > More > Cellular networks > Preferred network type.

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch Settings > 🇱 .
- Turn on 🌑
- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact the network carrier for details). When finished, touch **CONNECT**.

To enable notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Touch Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Touch 🚦 and then Advanced.
- Turn on Network notification ().

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

• Touch Settings > Wi-Fi.

- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch SAVE.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- On the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **FORGET** in the dialog that opens.

6.2 Connecting to a Bluetooth device ⁽¹⁾

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To turn on Bluetooth, touch ${\bf Settings}$ > ${\bf Bluetooth}.$ Your phone and other available devices will display on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Turn on Bluetooth 🌒 .

To make your phone more recognisable, you can rename your device.

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Touch and Rename this device.
- Enter a name, and touch **RENAME** to confirm.
- ⁽¹⁾ You are recommended to use alcatel Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to www.alcatel-mobile.com for more information about the alcatel Bluetooth headset.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Touch and Refresh.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to pair your phone with in the list.
- In the dialog that pops up, touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch 🏩 beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch FORGET to confirm.

6.3 Connecting to a computer via USB

With a USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and a computer.

To connect your phone to the computer

Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification of **USB** for file transfer.

The first time you connect the phone via USB, a debugging dialogue box pops up, touch OK to allow data exchange between your phone and computer, otherwise, you can use USB for charging only.

Touch **USB for file transfer**, choose the way in which you want to transfer files.By default, **File transfers** is selected.

6.4 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot or via Bluetooth.



The functions below may incur additional network charges from your network carrier. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that come with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- Touch Settings > More > Tethering & mobile hotspot.
- Turn on USB tethering ().

To share your phone's data connection as a mobile hotspot.

- Touch Settings > More > Tethering & mobile hotspot.
- Turn on Mobile hotspot 🌒 .

To share your phone's data connection via Bluetooth

- Go to Settings > More > Tethering & mobile hotspot.
- Turn on Bluetooth tethering

To rename or secure your mobile hotspot

When **mobile hotspot** is activated, you can rename your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Touch Settings > More > Tethering & mobile hotspot > Mobile hotspot.
- Touch **Set up mobile hotspot** to rename the network SSID or set your network security.
- Touch SAVE.

6.5 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch Settings > More > VPN and then touch +.
- On the screen that opens, follow your network administrator's instructions to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to/from VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch Settings > More > VPN.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch CONNECT.

To disconnect from a VPN:

• Touch the VPN you want to disconnect from. In the dialog that opens, touch **DISCONNECT**.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch Settings > More > VPN.
 - 61

- The VPNs you have added are listed . Long press the VPN you want to edit.
- Select 🍄 in the dialog that opens.
- After editing, touch **SAVE**.

To delete a VPN:

• Long press 🏶 to select the VPN you want to delete, then touch Delete profile.

7 Multimedia applications

7.1 Camera.....



Your mobile phone is fitted with a camera and a camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the camera or camcorder, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To take a photo or video, touch $\textcircled{\mbox{\scriptsize \mbox{\scriptsize le}}}$ from the Home screen and then touch $\mbox{\scriptsize \mbox{\scriptsize Camera}}.$



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder. Touch to capture. The picture will be automatically saved. You can also long press to take burst shots.

To shoot a video

Touch ot to start video recording. You can also touch (s) to take a picture during video recording.

Touch 🕕 to stop recording.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- \bullet Touch << then Gmail, Bluetooth, MMS, etc to share the photo or video.
- Touch 🔶 to return to Camera.

7.1.1 Modes and settings

Touch the mode names to switch between modes.

- Pano Touch to turn on panorama function. Touch the shutter button to start taking panoramic photo and move the phone towards your capture direction and overlap the two lines. Once the slots are filled, the photo will be automatically saved. If the slots are not fully filled, touch OK to save the photo.
 Face mask Apply fun effects to your face when taking a
- Face mask Apply fun effects to your face when taking a photo or recording a video.

• Video Record a video with Camera.

Settings

Photo

Touch **(**) to turn on or off **Zero shutter delay**, **Gesture shot**, and Face beauty when taking a photo.

 Face Beauty Face Beauty allows the user to apply a skin filter to their face. The beauty icon is only shows in front camera mode and when the Face Beauty setting is enabled (enabled by default). Default value when Face Beauty icon on is 0%.

Slide left or right to change filtering values

 Picture size Touch to select picture size.

Touch to change the camera mode to Pano, Photo, Video, etc.

Video

- Video quality Touch to select the video recording quality.

8.1 Files.....

To manage the files in your phone, touch () from the Home screen, then touch **Files**.

Files works with both external SD card and internal storage.

Files displays all data stored on the phone, including applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to phone, you can locate the application using Files, then touch it to install it in your phone.

Files allows you to perform and is really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

8.2 Sound Recorder.....

To record voice, touch $\textcircled{\mbox{\sc b}}$ from the Home screen, then touch $\fbox{\sc sc}$ Recorder.

Sound Recorder allows you to record voice/sound for seconds/hours.

Your phone is equipped with a radio $^{\rm (1)}$ with RDS $^{\rm (2)}$ functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with visual information related to the radio program displayed if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To listen to the radio, touch $\textcircled{\ensuremath{\textcircled{}}}$ from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{Radio}}.$



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

Google apps are preinstalled on your phone to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.

9.1 Chrome

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

9.2 Gmail

As the Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. With this application, you can receive and send mails, manage mails by labels, and archive mails, etc. Mails can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account.

9.3 Maps

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can get your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

9.4 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the internet.

9.5 Play Store

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

9.6 Drive

A file storage and synchronisation service created by Google, which allows users to store files in the cloud, share and edit files.

Files in Drive are well kept and you can reach your files from any device by logging in to your Google account. Files or folders can be shared privately with particular users having a Google account.

9.7 Play Music

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for internet-connected devices, the Google Play Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline.

9.8 Play Movies & TV

Movies and television shows can be viewed online via Google Play Movies & TV. You can also download movies and TV shows for offline viewing. Some content is only available for rental or purchase.

9.9 Duo

A video chat mobile app.

With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.

9.10 Photos

Google Photos stores and backs up your photos and videos. It also automatically analyses photos and organizes them into groups, so that you can quickly locate the photos you need.

9.11 Keep

A note taking application developed by Google.

You can insert images, lists, and record voice in your notes, and set time or location-based reminders for notes. Google Keep allows you to categorise notes by labels, and notes are searchable based on their color, whether they have reminders, audio, images, or are lists.

10 Settings

To go to Settings, touch () from the Home screen, then touch Settings.

10.1 Wireless & networks

10.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can access the internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

10.1.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, refer to "6.2 Connecting to a Bluetooth device".

10.1.3 Data usage

Mobile data

If you do not need to transmit data on cellular networks, turn off **Mobile data** to avoid incurring significant charges for data use on local carrier cellular networks, particularly if you do not have a mobile data agreement.

Set mobile data limit

By enabling **Set mobile data limit**, your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also set a data usage cycle and view data usage statistics, such as the amount of data used by each application.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently.

10.1.4 More > Airoplane mode

Turn on Airoplane mode switch () to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

10.1.5 More > Tethering & mobile hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (refer to **"6.4 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection"**).

10.1.6 More > VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspends-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN can't survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, refer to "6.5 Connecting to virtual private networks".

10.1.7 More > Cellular networks

Data roaming

Turn on **Data roaming** to connect to data services when roaming. Data roaming may result in significant roaming charges.

Preferred network type

Touch to set your preferred network type.

Access point names

Touch to select your preferred network and edit APN settings.

Network carriers

You can select a network carrier.

10.2 Device

10.2.1 Display

In this menu, you can adjust your screen brightness, wallpaper, sleep time, font size, etc.

To rotate screen contents when device is rotated, touch When device is rotated > Rotate the contents on screen.

10.2.2 Lock screen

Func

Touch to customize the application shortcuts displayed on your lock screen.

Fingerprint

Put your finger on the sensor to record a fingerprint identification or authorisation. You must lock first when you enable this function.

10.2.3 Notification

Touch an app to configure its notification access. You can choose to block all notifications from the app, silence notifications, change how notifications display on the lock screen, etc..

10.2.4 Sound

Touch to adjust call and notification ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

- Silent mode
- Turn on () to enable silent mode.
- Sound
- Set volume for media,alarm,ring,notification.
- Also vibrate for calls
- Turn on **())** to enable vibration for incoming calls.
- Do Not Disturb Touch to allow alarms, reminders, calls, etc. when Do Not Disturb mode is enabled.
- Phone ringtone Touch to set your incoming call ringtone.
- Default notification Touch to set the default sound for notifications. ringtone
- Default alarm Touch to set the default sound for alarms. ringtone
- Other sounds Touch to set dial pad tones, screen locking sounds, touch sounds and vibrate on touch.

10.2.5 Apps

Touch to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data usage and force them to stop.

In the **App permissions** menu of an application, you can grant permissions for each app, such as allowing the app to access your **Camera, Contacts, Location**, etc.

In the **Notifications** menu, you can configure whether to block the notifications from this app, hide sensitive content, etc.

10.2.6 Storage

Touch to monitor device storage and available space.

10.2.7 Battery

Touch any category in the battery management screen to view its power consumption.

10.2.8 Memory

Touch to view the total memory and the memory used by applications.

10.3 Personal

10.3.1 Location

On

Turn on to enable the use of information from Wi-Fi and cellular networks to determine your approximate location, for use in Google Maps, when you search, and so on. When you select this option, you're asked whether you consent to share your location anonymously with Google's location service.

Mode

Touch to select High accuracy, Battery saving or Device only mode.

- High accuracy: Use GPS, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and cellular network to determine location.
- Battery saving: Use Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and cellular network to determine location.
- Device only: Use GPS to determine location.

Recent location requests

This list shows the recent location requests.

10.3.2 Security

Encrypt phone

Requires a numeric PIN, pattern, or password to decrypt your phone each time you power it on.

Screen lock

Touch to set your screen unlock method. For example, you can unlock your phone by sliding the screen, entering a password, or drawing a pattern, etc.

Set up SIM card lock

- Turn on Lock SIM card switch () to lock the SIM card with a PIN code.
- Touch Change SIM PIN to change the PIN code.

Make passwords visible

Turn on **()** to show passwords as you type.

Device administrators

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

Unknown sources

Turn on **()** to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites, emails, or other locations other than Google Play Store.

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Google Play Store.

Storage type

Your storage type is set to Hardware-backed by default.

Trusted credentials

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

Install from SD card

Touch to install encrypted certificates from internal storage or SD card.

Clear credentials

Touch to remove all certificates.

Trusted agents

Touch to view and enable/disable trusted agents. To enable this function you must first set a screen lock.

Screen pinning

When this function is enabled, you can keep a window in view by touching the **Recent Apps** button and then the pin icon. In this case, the user cannot go to any other window or open any other app.

To stop pinning a window , long press both the ${\it Back}$ and ${\it Recent}$ ${\it Apps}$ buttons, then enter your screen unlock password/PIN/pattern.

Apps with usage access

Touch to display the apps which can track what apps you are using, and how frequently. Turn on (to allow permission.

10.3.3 Accounts

In this menu you can add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronize data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronize user data automatically.

Add account

Touch Add account to add an account for the selected app.

10.3.4 Google

This phone offers you Google account and services setting options.

10.3.5 Languages & input

In this menu you can set the language for your device and configure the on-screen keyboard, voice input settings, pointer speed, etc..

Languages

Touch to select the language and region.

Spell checker

Turn on ()) to enable the system to show suggested words.

Personal dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Text-to-speech output

- Preferred engine: Touch to choose a Preferred text-to-speech engine, touch to show more choices for each engine.
- Speech rate: Touch to open a dialog where you can select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.
- Listen to an example: Touch to play a brief sample of the speech synthesizer, using your current settings.
- Default language status: This will show status of your default language.

Pointer speed

Touch to open a dialog where you can change the pointer speed, touch $\ensuremath{\mathsf{OK}}$ to confirm.

10.3.6 Backup & reset

Back up my data

Turn on to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new phone for the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure in the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

Backup account

Touch to set your backup account.

Automatic restore

Turn on **()** to restore your backed-up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

Network settings reset

Touch to reset all network settings.

DRM reset

This operation will delete all the licences on your device.

Factory data reset

Erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded.

If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your phone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time until the screen lights up.

Turn on **m** to display the time using the 24-hour clock format.

10.4.2 Scheduled power on & off

Turn on the switches to enable scheduled power on/off, also preset vour power on/off time and repeat mode.

10.4.3 Printing

In this menu you can add and manage printers and printing services.

10.4.4 Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

TalkBack

Touch to enable spoken feedback from your phone.

Switch Access

Turn on **m** to control your phone with configurable key combinations. Touch **SETTINGS** on the top right of the screen to assign key combination for listed behaviours

Captions

Touch to turn on/off captions for phone screen.

Magnification gestures

Touch to turn on/off to activate/deactivate zoom in/out function by triple-tapping the screen.

Font size

Touch to enlarge or reduce the size of the text on screen .

Display size

Touch to make items on your screen smaller or larger. Some apps on your screen may change position.

High contrast text

Turn on **m** to activate high contrast text.

Power button ends call

Turn on main to enable Power button ends call.

Auto-rotate screen

Turn on **()** to activate auto-rotate screen. Content on the screen or the keyboard will be automatically rotated when you rotate your phone.

Speak passwords

Turn on () to speak passwords while typing.

Accessibility shortcut

Touch to enable/disable quick shortcuts for accessibility features.

Text-to-speech output

Touch to update the settings for text-to-speech output, such as the speech rate.

Long press delay

Touch to adjust the duration of touch and hold delay. This function enables your phone to differ touch and touch & hold, which may avoid incorrect operations.

Color inversion

Turn on **())** to turn on color inversion.

Color correction

Touch to turn on/off color correction.

10.4.5 Regulatory & safety

Touch to view product information.

10.4.6 About phone

This contains information ranging from Legal information, Model number, Android version, Android security patch level, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build number, Custom build version, to those listed below:

System updates

Touch to check for system updates.

Status

Touch to view the Battery status, Battery level, My phone number, Network, Signal strength, etc.

11 Making the most of your phone

11.1 Updates

You can use the Updates app or the Mobile Upgrade tool to download and install the latest software version on your device.

11.1.1 Updates

Use the **Updates** app to update your device software. To access **Updates**, touch the App drawer on the Home screen and select **Updates**. Alternatively, go to **Settings** > **About phone** > **System updates**.

Touch and the phone will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, touch the button, and when that's finished, touch to complete the update. Now your phone will have the latest version of the software. turn on data connection or Wi-Fi before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check frequency are also available once you restart the phone. If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, a dialog will pop up where you can choose to download the update or ignore. A notification will also appear in the status bar.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location

11.1.2 Mobile Upgrade

Download Mobile Upgrade from the alcatel website (www.alcatelmobile.com) and install it on your PC. Launch the tool and update your phone by following the step by step instructions (refer to the User Guide provided together with the tool). Your phone's software will now have the latest software.



All personal information will be permanently lost following the update process. We recommend you back up your personal data using Smart Suite before upgrading.

14 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service center, here are some instructions to help you troubleshoot your device:

- For optimal operation, fully charge the battery.
- To improve the phone's performance, remove unnecessary files or apps on your phone.
- Update your phone's software via the **Updates** application. Or you can touch **Settings** > **About phone** > **Updates** to update software.
- Reset your phone via Factory data reset. Touch Settings > Backup & reset > Factory data reset > RESET PHONE. Another method is to hold down the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time when your phone is powered off. All your phone data will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully back up your phone data before resetting.

and carry out the following checks:

My phone can't be switched on or is frozen

- When the phone can't be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed. Then switch it on again.
- When the phone falls into a loop during power on animation and the user interface can't be accessed, press and hold the **Volume down** key to enter Safe mode. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by third party applications.
- If neither method is effective, reset the phone by pressing the **Power** key and the **Volume up** key at the same time, selecting a language, and then selecting **Wipe data/Factory reset**. Press the **Volume key** to select, and press the **Power** key to confirm each selection.

My phone has not responded for several minutes

• If your phone doesn't respond, turn off your phone by pressing and holding the **Power** key until it turns off and then restart it again.

- If your phone has a removable battery, remove the battery and reinsert it, then restart the phone.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone.

My phone turns off by itself

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your phone, and make sure that the **Power** key is not accidentally pressed while the screen is unlocked.
- Check the battery charge level.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone.

My phone can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the **Alcatel** charger that comes with the phone.
- Ilf your phone has a removable battery, make sure that your battery is inserted properly and clean the battery contact if it's dirty. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger.
- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power has been empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charging indicator on the screen.

- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

My phone can't connect to a network or "No service" is displayed

- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded.

My phone can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.
- Check your phone's internet connection settings.
- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage.

• Try connecting at a later time or another location.

Invalid SIM card

- \bullet Make sure that the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see "Inserting or removing the SIM card").
- Make sure that the chip on your SIM card is not damaged.
- Make sure that the service of your SIM card is available.

My phone can't make outgoing calls

- Make sure that you have dialled a valid number and have touched **Call**.
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure that your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in Airoplane mode.

My phone can't receive incoming calls

- Make sure that your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- \bullet Check your subscription status with your carrier (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in Airoplane mode.

The caller's name/number doesn't appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your carrier.
- Your caller may have concealed his name or number.

I can't find my contacts

- Make sure that your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure that your SIM card is inserted properly.

• Import all contacts stored in SIM card to phone.

The sound quality of the calls is poor

- Adjust the volume during a call by pressing the Volume up/down key.
- Check the network strength. Move to a location with stronger signal strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector and speaker on your phone is clean.

I can't use the features described in the manual

- Check with your carrier to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require an **Alcatel** accessory.

When I select a number from my contacts, the number can't be dialled

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file.
- Make sure that you have selected the country code when calling an international number.

I can't add a contact

• Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files to the phone.

My callers can't leave messages on my voicemail

• Contact your network carrier to check service availability.

I can't access my voicemail

- Make sure that your carrier's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- \bullet Try later if the network is busy.

I can't send and receive MMS

- Check your phone storage as it might be full.
- Contact your network carrier to check service availability and MMS parameters.

- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your carrier.
- The server center may be swamped. Try again later.

SIM card PIN locked

• Contact your network carrier to obtain the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code.

I can't connect my phone to my computer.

- Check that your USB driver is installed properly.
- Check that you have marked the USB debugging checkbox.
- Make sure that you're using the right cable from the box.

I can't download new files

- Make sure that there is sufficient phone storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier.

The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

The battery drains too fast

- Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 180 minutes).
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.

- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used for extended periods of time.
- Deactivate Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.

The phone becomes warm following prolonged calls, game playing, internet surfing or running other complex applications

• This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data. Ending the above actions will make your phone return to normal temperature.

After Factory data reset is performed, I can't use my phone without entering Google account credentials

- After reset is performed, you must enter the original Google account credentials that were used on this phone.
- If you don't remember your Google account credentials, complete Google account recovery procedures.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorized repair center, but remember that it will not be regarded as warranty case.

The phone doesn't ring when a call or message arrives

- Make sure that Do Not Disturb mode (go to Settings > Sound > Do Not Disturb) is not activated.
- Press the Volume up/down key to adjust volume.

I forget some passwords/codes/keys on phone

- Perform Factory data reset.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorized repair center, but remember that it will not be regarded as warranty case.
