# Safety and use .....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

#### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their phone when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headset to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headset can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- Do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area;
- Check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from phone RF energy.

#### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the phone from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, phones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid, or an insulin pump, etc.. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the phone away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the phone and accessories without supervision.

If your phone has a removable cover, note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

If your phone is a unibody device, the back cover and battery are not removable. If you disassemble your phone the warranty will not apply. Disassembling the phone may damage the battery, and may cause leakage of substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc.). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is  $0^{\circ}C$  ( $32^{\circ}F$ ) to  $+40^{\circ}C$  ( $104^{\circ}F$ ).

At over 40°C (104°F) the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open, dismantle, or attempt to repair your phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw, or bend your phone.

# Radio waves .....

Proof of compliance with international standards (ICNIRP) or with European Directive 2014/53/EU (RED) is required of all phone models before they can be put on the market. The protection of the health and safety for the user and any other person is an essential requirement of these standards or this directive.

#### THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organisation (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR values under the ICNIRP guidelines for this device model are:

During use, the actual SAR values for this phone are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimise interference on the network, the operating power of your phone is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the phone, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 5 mm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the phone should be positioned at least this distance away from the body.

If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the phone the indicated distance away from the body.

Organisations such as the World Health Organisation and the US Food and Drug Administration have stated that if people are concerned and want to reduce their exposure they could use a hands-free device to keep the phone away from the head and body during phone calls, or reduce the amount of time spent on the phone.

# **1.2 Getting started**

#### 1.2.1 Set up

#### Inserting or removing the SIM/microSD card

Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out.

Power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM/microSD card.

#### Charging the battery

Connect battery charger to your phone and plug into the socket

- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).





To reduce power consumption and energy waste, disconnect your charger when the battery is fully charged; switch off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth. In Settings you can also lower the brightness of the screen, and shorten the length of time before the screen goes to sleep.

#### 1.2.2 Power on your phone

To turn your phone on, hold down the **Back/End** key until the phone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. Unlock your phone with a password before the Home screen can display if you've set a screen lock in Settings.

#### Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you should set the following options:

- Select the phone's language, then press the Right soft key to go next.
- Select an enabled Wi-Fi, then press Right soft key to go next.

Even if no SIM card is installed, your phone will still power on and you will be able to connect to a Wi-Fi network and use some of the phone's features.

#### 1.2.3 Power off your phone

To turn your phone off, hold down the **Back/End** key and select **Power off**.

#### 1.4.2 Change Home screen wallpaper

- From the Home screen, press the **Centre Soft Key** (1), select **Settings** icon (2) and then press the **Navigation Key** to select **personalisation**.
- Press the Navigation Key and select Display -> Wallpaper. Select the image location to browse from Camera, Wallpaper or Gallery.
- Select new image, press the **Right Soft Key** to save. Exit out and new image will be displayed on Home screen.



# 2.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number, press the **Call Key** to place the call, or press the **Right Soft Key** to select a contact from **Contacts**, and then press the up and down of the **Navigation Key** to select the desired contact and press the **Call Key**. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the **Back/End Key**  $\stackrel{\frown}{\supset}$ . To hang up the call, press the **Back/End Key**.



#### International call

To dial an international call, press  $\underline{*}_{+*}$  twice to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally press the **Call Key**.

#### **Emergency call**

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and press the **Call Key** to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card.

# 2.2 Answer or decline a call



When you receive a call:

- Press the Left Soft Key or Call Key to answer;
- Press the Right Soft Key or Back/End Key to decline.

# 2.3 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

- Press and hold 1 w to call voicemail.
- Follow the prompts to set up your voicemail account.
- <sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.



# 3.1 Consult your Contacts

**Contacts** enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can access this function by pressing the **Centre Soft Key** () from the Home screen and select **Contacts**.



- **1** Press the **Right Soft Key** to access more options.
- 2 Press the Centre Soft Key (1) to enter contact detail.
- Press the Left Soft Key in the contact list to create a new contact.

# 3.2 Adding a contact

In contacts list screen, press the **Left Soft Key** to add new contacts with detailed information.

### 3.3 Editing your contacts

In contacts list screen, press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, select **Edit contact**, and press the **Centre Soft Key** ( $\bullet$ ) to edit.



# 3.4 Deleting a contact

In contacts list screen, press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, select **Delete contact**, and press the **Right Soft Key** to delete.



# 3.5 Sharing your contacts

You can share a single contact with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Email, Messages, WhatsApp and Bluetooth.

Select a contact you want to share, press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, and then select **Share**.

### 3.6 Available options

From the contact list, you can access the following options:

#### Call

Make a call to the selected contact.

#### Send message

Send an SMS/MMS to a contact you selected from Contacts.

#### Settings

• Sort contacts

Press the **Centre Soft Key** to choose contacts sorted by first name or by last name.

• Import contacts

Import contacts between memory card, Gmail and outlook.

• Export contacts

Export contacts between memory card and Bluetooth.

• Set ICE contacts

Add five contacts for making " In Case of Emergency" calls.

#### • Set speed dial contacts

Set one or more speed dial contacts at a time



Use the messaging feature to send and receive text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages.

### 4.1 Write message

- From the Home screen, press the **Centre Soft Key** ③ and select **Messages**.
- Press the Left Soft Key to write text messages.
- Enter the phone number of the recipient in the **To** bar or press the **Right Soft Key** to add recipients.
- Press the **Message** bar to enter the text of the message.
- Press the Left Soft Key to send text messages.



# 4.2 Send a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, contacts and sounds . From the Message screen, select **New > Options > Add attachment**, to access all the messaging options

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached or email addresses added.

#### 4.3 How to type a message

When in edit mode, the default input method is English, you can press Keypad to change the input method to access numbers 1,2,3... or long press the corresponding key to get the number you want.

You can enter text using predictive text input. To set your desired text input, please select Settings () > personalisation > Input methods.

- For normal text input, press a number key, 2-9, repeatedly until the desired character is displayed. If the next letter your want is located on the same key as the present one, press the **Centre Soft Key** (a) until the next cursor is displayed.
- Press |# ↔ w key to switch among "abc--> ABC--> 123" mode.

- To insert a punctuation mark or special character, please press <u>\* + +</u> key.

# 4.4 Settings

The messages settings menu lets you control options for your text and MMS messages including message limits, size settings, and notifications.

On the Messages screen, press the **Right Soft Key** to select **Options > Settings**. You can set the following:

• Auto retrieve messages

Press to disable auto-retrieve or enable auto retrieve with/without roaming.

• WAP Push

Mark the checkbox to enable receipt of push messages from network.

• Wireless emergency alerts

Press to enter Emergency alerts options.

• Delivery report

Mark the checkbox to request a delivery report for each text message you send.



You can access this function by pressing the **Centre Soft Key** (1) from the Home screen and select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter your name in outgoing emails, the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- Press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Next**. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually.
- To add another email account, you can press the Left Soft Key to access Advanced.

#### To create and send emails

- Press the Left Soft Key to compose a new email from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the **To** field.
- If necessary, press the **Right Soft Key** to add **Cc/Bcc** or add attachment to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.

Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera and a Camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

#### To take a picture

# 6.2 Camcorder

- Press the right side of **Navigation key** to switch to Video mode from Camera mode.

It enables to set the picture as wallpaper or image for existing contact.

View the picture information, such as name, size, image type and etc.

After the picture locked, you could not delete, edit, rename and rotate this picture until it's unlocked.

It enables to sort picture by date and time, name, size and etc. and group by date.

### 11.1 Multimode view

# 11.2 To create new events

Press the **Left Soft Key** to add new events from any Calendar view.

# **14** FM Radio.....

Your phone is equipped with a radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS <sup>(2)</sup> functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, press the **Centre Soft Key** from the Home screen and select **FM Radio**.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

#### Carrier

When SIM card inserted, the phone will detect carrier automatically.

#### **Data Connection**

If you do not need to transmit data on all mobile networks, turn off **Data connection** to avoid incurring significant charges for data use on local operator mobile networks, particularly if you do not have a mobile data agreement.

#### Data Roaming

If you don't need to transmit data on other operators' mobile networks, disable **Data roaming** to avoid incurring significant roaming charges.

#### **APN Settings**

You can select APN types or add new APN.

#### 15.1.3 Geolocation

KaiOS uses GPS outdoors to approximate your location.

Location data may be used by KaiOS and service providers to improve accuracy and coverage of the location databases.

#### 15.1.4 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

#### 15.1.5 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

Press to active or deactive call barring.

#### 15.1.7 Internet Sharing

#### Wi-Fi hotspot

Allow other devices to share your phone's internet connection by connecting via Wi-Fi.

#### **USB** tethering

You can share your phone's internet connection with a USB-connected device.

#### 15.1.8 Wireless Emergency Alerts

#### Alert Inbox

Press to view alert message in alert box.

#### Extreme alert

Mark the checkbox to enable extreme alert.

#### Severe alert

Mark the checkbox to enable severe alert.

#### AMBER alert

Mark the checkbox to enable amber alert.

#### **Presidential alert**

Mark the checkbox to enable presidential alert.

#### WEA Ringtone

Press to preview alert tone.

#### **Required monthly test**

Mark the checkbox to enable the requirement of monthly test

#### 15.2.1 Sound

#### Volume

Press to set volume for Media, Rightones & Alerts and Alarm.

#### Tones

Press to manage tones.

#### **Other Sounds**

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Press}}$  to enable/disable the sound for Dial pad and Camera.

### 15.2.2 Display

• Wallpaper

Press to select wallpaper from Wallpaper, Gallery or Camera.

• Brightness

Press to set the level of brightness.

• Screen Timeout

Press to set screen timeout.

• Auto Keypad Lock

Press to enable or disable the auto keypad lock

#### 15.2.3 Search

#### Search Engine

Press to select search engine.

#### Search Suggestions

Press to enable or disable search suggestions.

### 15.2.4 Notices

#### Show on lock screen

Press to enable or disable notice show on lock screen.

#### **APP Notices**

Press to enable or disable all APPs' notices.

#### 15.2.5 Date & Time

#### Auto Sync

Press to enable or disable auto-sync.

#### Date

Only after disable auto-sync will you set the phone's date manually.

#### Time

Only after disable auto-sync will you set the phone's time manually.

#### Time Zone

Only after disable auto-sync will you set the phone's timezone manually.

#### **Time Format**

Press to select 12-hour clock format or 24-hour clock format.

#### Home Screen Clocks

Press to enable or disable the clocks shown on the Home screen.

#### 15.2.6 Language

Press to select the language and the region you want.

#### 15.2.7 Input methods

Press to select input languages.

# 15.3 Privacy & Security

#### 15.3.1 Screen Lock

Screen lock allows you to set a 4-digit password which protects your phone from intrusions. Whoever turns on your phone will be prompted to enter a password in order to access your device.

#### 15.3.2 SIM Security

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your phone.

# 15.5 Device

#### 15.5.1 Device Information

This contains information about things ranging from Phone number, Software version, Hardware Revision, Platform version, Bluetooth address, Build number and etc.

#### 15.5.2 Downloads

Press to view downloads.

#### 15.5.3 Battery

Press to set power saving mode.

Turning power saving mode on will turn off the phone's data, Bluetooth and Geolocation connections to extend battery life.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout settings in the Display screen.

### 15.5.4 Accessibility

#### **Invert Colours**

Press to turn on/off colour inversion.

#### Backlight

Press to turn on/off backlight.

#### Large Text

Large text enable to enlarge the screen text.

#### Captions

Press to activate/deactivate captions for phone screen.

#### Mono Audio

Press to turn on/off mono audio.

#### **Volume Balance**

Press to set volume balance value.

#### **Keypad Vibration**

Press to activate/deactivate keypad vibration

#### Hearing Aid Compatibility(HAC)

Hearing aid mode can be used by people who are deaf, have poor hearing or speech impairments. After connecting the phone and hearing aid device, calls are linked to a relay service, which converts incoming speech to text for the person using the hearing aid and converts outgoing text from the hearing aid device to a spoken voice for the person on the other end of the conversation.

and carry out the following checks:

#### My phone can't be switched on or is frozen

- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your phone on.
- Check the battery power level, charge for at least 20 minutes.

#### My phone has not responded for several minutes

- Restart your phone by pressing and holding the End/ Back/End Key.
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then restart the phone.

#### My phone turns off by itself

- Check whether your phone is locked when not in use, and make sure you don't accidentally turn off your phone when locking it by pressing the **Back/End Key**.
- Check the battery charge level.

#### My phone can't charge properly

- Make sure you are using an **Alcatel** battery and the charger from the box.
