
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Your device

1.1 Keys and connectors





Recents key

• Touch to switch between individual app activities and documents.



Home key

• From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.



Back key

• Touch to go back to the previous screen, or close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.



Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Power off/ Restart.
- Press and hold the **Power** key and **Volume down** key to make a screenshot.
- Press and hold the **Power** key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.

Volume Keys

- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the ringtone volume.
- In camera preview mode, press Volume up or down key to take a photo.

1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Set up

Inserting or removing the SD card.

Your device only supports SD cards. Do not attempt to insert SIM types like micro SIM and standard cards; otherwise this may cause damage to your device.




Charging the battery

You are advised to fully charge the battery (). Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the device is powered off. The percentage increases as the device is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.



1.2.2 Power on your device

Hold down the **Power** key until the device powers on, unlock your device (Swipe, PIN, Password, Pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

1.2.3 Power off your device

Hold down the Power key until options appear, select Power off.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to the Home screen.

	 Search bar Touch ● to enter text search screen. Touch ● to enter voice search screen.
	_Touch an icon to open an application, folder, etc.
	 Favourite tray applications Touch to enter the application. Long press to move or remove applications.

The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch

To access an application, touch it with your finger.



To enter the available options for an item, long press the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, long press this contact, an options list will appear.

Drag



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can slide the screen horizontally too.

The device also supports one finger zooming in the Camera and Gallery functions. Double touch the screen to zoom in/out.

Flick



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

Pinch/Spread

Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the device sideways to have a better screen view.

1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both device status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the quick settings panel.

Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you can touch them to access notifications.

Notification panel

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.



-Touch to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

Quick settings panel

Touch and drag down the Notification panel or touch the down-sided arrow to open the Quick settings panel. You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons. Touch the EDIT button to customise your Quick settings panel.



Touch to access **Settings**, where you can set more items.

Touch to enter user screen to edit and save owner's name, device number, and other information.

1.3.3 Search bar

The device provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the device or the web.



Search by text

- Touch the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch the Q icon on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

Search by voice

- Touch U from the Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your device and privacy, you can lock the device screen by choosing slide or creating a pattern, PIN or password, etc.

To create a screen unlock pattern

- From the Home screen, touch ∧ to open the applications list, then touch Settings>Security >Screen lock>Pattern.
- Draw your own pattern.


To lock device screen

Press the Power key once to lock the screen.

To unlock the device screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, slide to draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter your PIN or password, etc. to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Swipe** as the screen lock, you can press the **Power** key to light up the screen, then swipe up to unlock the screen.



1.3.5 Personalise your Home screen

Add

You can long press a folder, an application or a widget to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

Reposition

Long press the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Long press the item then touch the $\hfill \circ$ icon, and enter into App info, then disable/ FORCE STOP this function.

Create folders

To improve the organisation of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Long press the empty area in the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\mathsf{WALLPAPERS}}$ to customise wallpaper.

1.3.6 Widgets and recently-used applications

Consult widgets

Long press the empty area in the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\mathsf{WIDGETS}}$ to display all widgets.

Touch the selected widget and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

Consult recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, touch **Touch** a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and slide it right to close the corresponding application

Touch _____ at the middle bottom of the screen to close all the running applications.

1.3.7 Volume adjustment

Using the volume key

Press the Volume key to adjust the volume.

Using the settings menu

From the Home screen, touch \land to open the applications list, then touch **Settings>Sound** to set the volume of media, ringtone, alarm, etc. to your preference.


Text input

1.1 Using the Onscreen Keyboard

Onscreen Keyboard settings

Touch Settings>System>Language & input, touch the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

1.1.1 Virtual keyboard



1.2 Text editing

You can edit the texts you entered.

- · Long press or double touch within the texts you want to edit.
- · Drag the tabs to change the checked texts.
- The following options will show: CUT, COPY and SHARE.



You can also insert new texts if preferred

- Touch where you want to type, or long press the blank, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have cut or copied any text, touch the tab to show the PASTE icon which allows you to complete pasting immediately.


2 Contacts & Gmail

2.1 Contacts

Contacts enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your device and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your device.

2.1.1 Consult your Contacts



Delete a contact

To delete a contact, long press the contact you want to delete, then touch

The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the device or web the next time you synchronise your device.

Touch $\ensuremath{\stackrel{\bullet}{\bullet}}$ to display the contacts list option menu, following actions are enabled:

Select Touch to select one contact that you want
 Select all Touch to select all contacts
 Customise view Touch to set the contact display, like All contacts or Cutomise which you can set for different groups.

2.1.2 Adding a contact

Touch + in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.

2.1.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch
in the contact details screen to edit.

When finished, touch SAVE to save.

2.1.4 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

This tablet enables you to import contacts from your SD card to your tablet, and export your tablet contacts via a .vcf file for sharing with others

From the Contacts screen, touch \equiv to open the options menu, touch Settings> Import/Export.

To share a contact. long press the contact you want to share, then touch < . You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

2.1.5 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your device.

To add an account, touch $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ from the home screen, then Settings\Users & accounts\ Add account.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account setup, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the device. Touch the account you want to delete, touch **REMOVE ACCOUNTS**, then confirm.

Turn on/off the auto-sync

In the Accounts screen, mark the Automatically-sync data checkbox. When activated, all changes to information on the device or online will be automatically synchronised with each other.

2.2 Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your device. Gmail on your device can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web.

2.2.1 To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch Gmail.

2.2.2 To create and send emails

• Touch the icon 🕜 from the Inbox screen.

- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in **To** field, and if necessary, touch the downward arrow to add a copy (Cc) or a blind copy (Bcc) to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch C to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the > icon to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch and Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch the icon , then select Drafts.
- If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch and **Settings** from inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

2.2.3 To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an \bowtie icon will appear on the Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel and touch the new email to view it. You can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, subject, label, etc.

- \cdot Touch the $\mathbf{Q}_{\mathbf{k}}$ icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the search box and touch ${f Q}$.

2.2.4 To reply or forward emails

Reply	When viewing an email, touch (to reply to the sender of this mail.
Reply all	Touch and select "Reply all" to send the message to all people in a mail loop.
Forward	Touch and select "Forward" to forward the received mail to other people.
 Add star 	Touch and select "Add star" to add a star for the mail.
Print	Touch [‡] and select " Print " to print the mail.

2.2.5 Managing Gmails by Labels

To conveniently manage conversations and messages, you can organise them using a Label.

To label a conversation when reading a conversation's messages, touch $\overset{\bullet}{\bullet}$ and then choose Move to.

To view conversations by labels when viewing your inbox or another conversation list, touch the icon , then touch a label to view a list of conversations with that label.

Long press an email to activate batch mode and produce the following options:



Touch to archive the email message. To display the archived messages, you can touch in Inbox screen then touch All mail.



Touch to delete the email message.



Touch to mark an email message as read or unread.

Touch to access the following options.

Move to	Touch to move the mail to other labels.
Change labels	Touch to change the label of the email message or conversation.
Add star	Touch to remark in star for the mail
 Mark as important 	To Mark the email as important or not important.
• Mute	Touch to hide the mail and the mail could be found by touching All mail .
Report spam	To report the email message/conversation as spam.

2.2.6 Gmail settings

To access Gmail settings, touch the icon **and select Settings**.

Touch an account to view the following settings:

- Inbox type To set this inbox as the default or priority Inbox.
- Inbox categories Mark the checkbox to enable the folder to appear under the Inbox folder.
- Notifications
 Mark the checkbox to activate a notification when a new email arrives.
- Manage notifications Touch to set the notifications' action
- Default reply action Touch to set the default reply action: Reply or Reply to all.
- Mobile signature To add a signature text to the end of each mail you send.
- Smart Reply
 Mark the checkbox to show suggested replies when
 available
- Out of Office Touch to set the AutoReply when out of office AutoReply
- Sync Gmail Mark the checkbox to turn on/off Gmail sync.
- Days of mail to sync Touch to set the duration of days for mail sync.
- Download Mark the checkbox to auto download attachments to recent messages via Wi-Fi.
- Images Touch to set whether images are always shown or if you will be prompted to show them.

3 Calendar & Clock & Calculator

3.1 Calendar

Use the Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, touch Calendar from the Home screen.

3.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar by Schedule, Day Week, or Month.

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Schedule view

3.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch (+) to access a new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select All-day.

- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you want to invite with commas to separate. The guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, touch SAVE from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Week view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area which will then turn +, and touch the icon to create the new event.

3.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen, touch the \checkmark icon to edit the event, and touch \therefore Delete to delete.

3.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon \blacksquare will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the notification panel, touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch the $\ensuremath{\text{Back}}$ key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the notification panel.

3.2 Clock

Your device has a built-in clock.

To view the current time, touch \land from the Home screen, then touch Clock.

3.2.1 World clock

To view the world clock, touch () on the Time screen.

Touch the 🜰 icon to add a time zone.

3.2.2 Alarm

From the Time screen, touch 💽 to enter the Alarm screen.

Touch the switch **()** to enable the alarm.

Touch + to add a new alarm, the following options will appear:

- Time Touch to set the alarm time.
- Repeat Touch to select the days when you want the alarm to work.
- Ringtone Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.
- Delete Touch to delete the alarm

Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.

Touch \mathbf{v} then touch \square to delete the selected alarm.

3.2.3 Countdown

From the Time screen, touch X to enter the Countdown screen.

- Enter the time. The time should be typed in second, minute and hour number sequence.
- Touch **(**) icon to activate Countdown.
- Touch ADD TIMER to set the countdown time in panel.
- Touch III icon to deactivate Countdown.
- Touch **DELETE** to delete current countdown label.

3.2.4 Timer

From the Time screen, touch 🚺 to enter the Timer screen.

- Touch **>** to activate the timer.
- Touch LAP to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- Touch U to halt the total and lap times. These will only restart after b is touched.
- Touch **RESET** to reset the record.

3.2.5 Adjust Clock settings

Touch the icon and then **Settings**, the following options can now be adjusted:

• Style	Touch to set the clock style to Analogue or Digital.
Automatic home clock	Mark the checkbox to enable the function when travelling in an area where the time is different, add a clock for home.
Home time zone	Touch to set Home time zone.
Silence after	Touch to set a temporary turn off time for an alarm.
Snooze length	Touch to set the duration of alarms.
Alarm volume	Touch to set alarm volume.
 Gradually increase volume 	Touch to choose the time to gradually increase volume
Volume buttons	Touch to set side Volume up/down key behaviours when alarm sounds: Snooze, Dismiss or Do nothing.
 Start week on 	Touch to choose which day as the one to start week on

3.3 Calculator

With the Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To use the calculator, touch $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ from the Home screen, then touch Calculator.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, turn the device to the landscape mode from the basic panel or swipe left to open the Advanced panel $^{\!(1)}\!\!$

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Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed, enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch **DEL** to delete digits one by one, long press **DEL** to delete all at one time.

4 Getting connected

To connect to the internet with this device, you can use Wi-Fi.

4.1 Connecting to the Internet

4.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your device is within range of a wireless network.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch Settings> Network & Internet>Wi-Fi.
- Touch the switch
 to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- Once Wi-Fi is on, the detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you
 are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact the network
 operator for details). When finished, touch Connect.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the device detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- · Touch Settings.
- Touch Wi-Fi, scroll to the bottom, then touch Wi-Fi preferences.
- · Switch the toggle Open network notificaiton to activate/deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch Settings.
- Touch Wi-Fi, scroll to the bottom and touch Add network.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch SAVE.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch FORGET in the dialog that opens.

4.2 Chrome

Using Chrome, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To surf the web, touch from Chrome the Home screen.

To go to a web page

On the Chrome screen, touch the URL bar at the top, enter the address of the web page, then confirm.



To set a homepage

- Touch the icon from Chrome screen to display option menu, touch Settings\
 Homepage.
- Touch the switch on to set this website as your homepage.

Viewing web pages

When opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

To find text on a web page

- Touch the icon from Chrome screen to display option menu, and touch Find in page.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- Words with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- When finished, you can touch the **Back** key to close the search bar.

Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text from a web page:

- · Long press the text to highlight the text.
- · Move two tabs to select the text.
- Touch the icon to show further actions, including search on the web.
- When finished, touch the Back key to deactivate the mode.

To open new window/switch between windows

- Touch _____ to open a new window.
- Touch **icon** and **New incognito tab** to open a window without any trace.
- To close a window, touch imes on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

4.2.1 Manage links, history, downloads

To manage a link, device number or address displayed on a web page

• Link	Touch the link to open the web page.
	Long press the link to open options for further operation, like open in new window, download link, share link, copy link address, copy link text, etc.
Device number	Touch to call the device number.
Address	Touch to open Google Maps and locate the address.

To download a web application/view your downloads

To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, select the item to be cancelled, and touch \Box to confirm.

4.2.2 Manage bookmarks

To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch the
 A
 icon in the web page .

To open a bookmark

- Touch the icon and Bookmarks.
- Touch the bookmark you want to open.

To edit a bookmark

- Touch the icon and Bookmarks.
- · Long press the bookmark you want to edit.
- Touch 🖍, and enter your changes.
- Touch 💽 to move the bookmark to a folder.
- Touch 📋 to delete a bookmark.

4.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices⁽²⁾

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To exchange data, touch **Settings>Connected devices >Bluetooth**, your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- · Touch Settings>Connected devices >Bluetooth.
- Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your device more recognisable, you can change your device's name which is visible to others.

- Touch Settings>Connected devices >Bluetooth.
- Touch Device name, enter a name, then touch RENAME to confirm.

To pair/connect your device with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your device with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch Settings>Connected devices >Bluetooth.
- Touch Pair new device.
- · Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- A dialog will pop up, touch PAIR to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your device connects to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the Settings icon 🗱 beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch FORGET to confirm.

4.4 Connecting to a computer

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your internal storage and a computer.

To connect your device to the computer

Use the USB cable that came with your device to connect the device to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.

Open the Notification panel and choose for three different modes below:

-Charge this device

-Transfer files

-Transffer photos(PTP)

4.5 Sharing your device's Wi-Fi connection

You can share your device's Wi-Fi connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your device into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

To share your device's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that come with your device to connect the device to a USB port on your computer.

- Touch Settings\Network & Internet\Tethering.
- Touch the switch beside USB tethering to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your device's data connection via Bluetooth

Use the bluetooth that come with your device to connect the device to a bluetooth port on your computer.

- Touch Settings\Network & Internet\Tethering.
- Touch the switch beside Bluetooth tethering to activate/deactivate this function.

4.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch Settings>Network & Internet >VPN and then touch + .
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a PIN code or password for your device.

To connect/disconnect VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch CONNECT.

To disconnect:

- After editing, touch SAVE.



5 Multimedia applications

5.1 Camera/Camcorder

Your device is fitted with a Camera and a Camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera or Camcorder, be sure to remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.



To take a photo or video, touch Camera from the Home screen.

To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary and touch the focus is income to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

Switch to the video mode by touching VIDEO icon besides, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and touch the control icon to start recording. Touch the control icon to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- · Touch the circle in the lower left part to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch the icon $\overset{\boldsymbol{<}}{\underset{\mathtt{share}}{\overset{\boldsymbol{<}}}}$ icon to share the photo or video via Gmail, Bluetooth, etc.
- Touch the icon e_{Edit} to edit the photos and videos.
- Touch icon to delete the photos and videos.

5.1.1 Modes and settings

Settings

Touch setting 📩 to set under options:

- Scene mode Set for night mode.
- Set the countdown before taking a photo.
- Picture size
 Touch to select picture size.

5.2 Photos

Photos act as a media player for you to view photos and play videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To view the photos you have taken, touch **Photo** icon **S** in the home screen.



Working with pictures

Touch a picture you want to work on, touch the \square icon to delete a selected one. Touch \blacksquare to share selected ones.

Touch the icon>Use as to set them as contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Batch operation

The **Photos** provide a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/ videos in batches.

Open the **Photos** window, long press one picture, touch the icon to delete photos, move the selected files to trash. Touch to share selected files, touch to **Delete from device**, **Back up now**, or **Archive**.

5.3 Kid Mode

Kid mode provides you a kid-friendly and parent-friendly mode.

Parent can set usage time and select which apps are available to use for kids, authorise or not for kid accessing to the web.

Kid can also enjoy the pre-approved apps and pre-loaded popluar games, and personialize their own interface and take picture to change avatar.

Touch **Kid Mode** icon 📴 in the home screen to view it.

5.3.1 Parental Password

When openning the app for the first time the parent is prompted to set a password for parental controls.



The parents will be prompted to Set a security question in case they need to reset their password.

5.4 Kid Mode Settings

The settings are constomized for parental contrals:

Add apps: to select the apps for kids.

Device usage time limits: to set the usage time for kids.

Wallpaper: touch the wallpaper icon and there will be three wallpaper for selection.

App usage time limits: set the time limits that the kids use the app.

Reset password: you need to enter the password used currently, then enter the new password and confirm.

Reset Reminder: enable it, your kids will be reminded of resting their eyes every 30 minutes.

Blue light filter: enable it to reduce blue light and help prevent visual fatigue.

Charge protection: prevent the device from being used whiling charging.

To exit the kid mode, touch 🗐 and enter the password.

6 Others

6.1 File Manager

To manage the files in your device, touch $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ from the Home screen, then touch Files Go.

Files Go work with both external SD card and internal storage.

Files Go display all data stored on the device, including applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to device, you can locate the application using Files, then touch it to install it in your device.

Files Go allow you to perform and is really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

6.2 Other applications⁽³⁾

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your device. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, refer to the leaflet provided with the device. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Google Play Store on your device.

7 Google applications

Google apps are preinstalled on your device to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.

7.1 Gmail

As the Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your device. With this application, you can receive and send mails, manage mails by labels, and archive mails, etc. Mails can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account.

7.2 Maps Go

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can get your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

7.3 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

7.4 Play Store

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

7.5 Play Music

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for Internet-connected devices, the Google Play Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline. Songs purchased through the Play Music are automatically added to the user's account.

8 Settings

To go to Settings, touch \wedge from the Home screen, then touch Settings.

8.1 Network & Internet

8.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your device to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, refer to "5.1.1 Wi-Fi".

8.1.2 Tethering

This function allows you to share your device's Wi-Fi connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (refer to "5.5 Sharing your device's Wi-Ficonnection").

8.1.3 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspends-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN can't survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, refer to "5.6 Connecting to virtual private networks".

8.2 Connected devices

This function allows you to use Bluetooth to connect your device to other devices. (refer to "5.3 connecting to Bluetooth devices")

8.3 Apps & notifications

Touch to view details about the applications installed on your device, to manage their data usage and force them to stop.

In the App permissions menu of an application, you can grant permissions for the app, such as allowing the app to access your Camera, Contacts, Location, etc.

8.4 Battery

Touch any category in the battery management screen to view its power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout settings in the Display screen.

8.5 Display

In this menu, you can adjust your screen brightness level, wallpaper, font size, etc.

Brightness level

Touch to set the brightness of the screen or enable the automatic brightness mode.

Eye care

Touch to activate/disactivate eye care automatically.

Wallpaper

You choose the wallpaper of your screen from Gallery, Photos, or Wallpapers.

Sleep

Set your device to enter the sleep mode after a specified period of time, such as 1 minute or 30 seconds.

Auto-rotate screen

Set your device to rotate the screen contents or stay in portrait view when the device is rotated.

Font size

Touch to set the size of the fonts displayed on your screen.

Display size

This function makes the items on your screen smaller or larger. Some apps may change position.

8.6 Sound

Sound	Set volume for media, ringtone, notifications, and alarms.
 Do not disturb preferences 	Touch to allow alarms, reminders, etc. when Do not disturb mode is enabled. $\label{eq:constraint}$
 Default notification sound 	Touch to set the default sound for notifications.
 Default alarm sound 	Touch to set the default sound for alarms.
Other sounds	Touch to set dial pad tones, screen locking sounds, touch sounds, power on $\&\ {\rm off}\ ringtone$

8.7 Storage

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your device and touch to view the total memory and the memory used by applications.

8.8 Security & Location

Security status

-Google Play Protect

Touch to enable/disable Google Play Protect which can regularly checks your apps and device for harmful behaviour when turns on.

-Find My Device

Check this function to remotely locate this device, or allow remote lock and erase.

-Security update

Check if your system is up to date, if not, touch Check for update to upgrade.

You can specify a maximum of five app shortcuts displayed on the lock screen.

Screen lock

Touch to set your screen unlock method. For example, you can unlock your device by sliding the screen, entering a password, or drawing a pattern, etc.

Lock screen preferences

Touch set the status show on the lock screen & Lock screen message, or add users from lock screen.

Smart Lock

Touch to set your device to automatically unlocked as long as it's in motion, like when you're holding or carrying your device. Your device will lock when it detects that it's been set down.

Location

-On

Touch the **Section** switch to enable the use of information from Wi-Fi and mobile networks to determine your approximate location, for use in Google Maps, when you search, and so on. When you select this option, you're asked whether you consent to share your location anonymously with Google's location service.

-Mode

Touch to select High accuracy, Battery saving or Device only mode.

• High accuracy: Use GPS, Wi-Fi and mobile network to determine location.

-Recent location requests

This list shows the recent location requests.

Show passwords

Switch the toggle to show passwords as you type

Device admin apps

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

Encrypt & credentials

-Encryption

Requires a numeric PIN, pattern, or password to decrypt your device each time you power it on.

- Credential storage
- · Storage type: Touch to check the hardware-backed
- Trusted credentials: Touch to display trusted CA certificates
- · User credentials: Touch to view and modify stored credentials
- Install from SD card:Touch to install encrypted certificates from internal storage or SD card.

Trusted agents

View or deactivate trust agents.

Screen pinning

When this function is enabled, you can always keep a window in view by touching the **Overview** button and then the pin icon. In this case, the user cannot go to any other window or open any other app.

To stop pinning a window in view, long press both the **Back** and **Overview** keys together, then entering your screen unlock password or drawing your unlock pattern.

Apps with usage access

Touch to display the apps which can track what apps you are using, and the using frequency. You can switch the toggle to turn on/off the permission.

8.9 User & accounts

This feature allows you to add another user account. When a friend need to use your device, switch to the guest account so that information in the main account cannot be accessed.

8.10 Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your device.

Volume key shortcut

Touch to enable/disable quick activating for accessibility features.

Text-to-speech output

Touch to update the settings for text-to-speech output, such as the speech rate.

Font size

Touch to set the size of the fonts displayed on your screen.

Display size

This function makes the items on your screen smaller or larger. Some apps may change position.

Magnification

Touch to turn on/off to activate/deactivate zoom in/out function by triple-tapping the screen.

Colour correction

Touch to turn on/off colour correction.

Colour inversion

Touch the switch to turn on/off colour inversion.

Large mouse cursor

Touch the switch to activate large mouse cursor.

Click after cursor stops moving

Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

Auto-rotate screen

Touch the switch to activate auto-rotate screen. Content on the screen or the keyboard will be automatically rotated when you rotate your device.

Touch & hold delay

Touch to adjust the duration of touch and hold delay. This function enables your device to differ touch and touch & hold, which may avoid incorrect operations.

Mono audio

Touch to activate/deactivate combining channels when playing audio.

Captions

Touch to activate/deactivate captions for device screen.

High contrast text

Touch the switch to activate high contrast text.

8.11 Google

Touch to check Google services & preferences.

8.12 System

8.12.1 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your device and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

Virtual keyboard

Touch to manage virtual keyboard.

Physical keyboard

Touch to set the physical keyboard.

Spell checker

Switch the toggle to enable the system to show suggested words.

Auto-fill service

Touch to set Anto-fill service for None or Auto-fill with Google

Personal dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Pointer speed

Touch to open a dialog where you can change the pointer speed, touch OK to confirm.

Text-to-speech output

- Preferred engine: Touch to choose a Preferred text-to-speech engine, touch the settings icon to show more choices for each engine.
- · Language: Touch to chosse language preferred.
- Speech rate: Touch to open a dialog where you can select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.
- Pitch: Touch to set the pitch you want the synthesizer to speak.

8.12.2 Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customise your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

Automatic date & time

Touch the switch to use the network-provided date and time.

Set date

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the device's date.

Set time

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the device's time.

Select time zone

Touch to open a dialog where you can set the device's time zone.

Use 24-hour format

Touch the switch to display the time using the 24-hour clock format.

8.12.3 Backup

Touch the switch to back up your device's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your device, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new device for the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure in the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

Backup account

Touch to set your backup account.

8.12.4 Reset options

Touch to reset your device.

DRM reset

Touch to delete all DRM licenses.

Reset Wi-Fi, Bluetooth

Touch to reset all network settings.

Reset app preferences

Touch to reset all preference for:

- -Disabled apps
- -Disabled app notificaitons
- -Default applications for actions
- -Background data restrictions for apps
- -Any permission restrictions

Erase all data(factory reset)

Erase all of your personal data from internal device storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the device does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded.

If you reset the device in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your device, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time until the screen lights up.

8.12.5 Regulatory & safety

Touch to view product information like Product model, Manufacture name/address, IMEI, Bluetooth Declaration ID, and some certification logo or text.

8.12.6 About tablet

This contains information ranging from Legal information, Model number, Firmware version, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build number to those listed below:

Status

This contains the status of the Battery status, Battery level, IP address, Wi-Fi MAC address, Bluetooth address, SN etc.

9 Upgrade

You can use the Device Upgrade tool or FOTA Upgrade tool to update your device's software.

9.1 Device Upgrade

Download Mobile Upgrade from alcatel website (www.alcatelmobile.com) and install it on your PC. Launch the tool and update your device by following the step by step instructions (refer to the User Guide provided together with the tool). Your device's software will now have the latest software.



All personal information will be permanently lost following the update process. We recommend you back up your personal data using Smart Suite before upgrading.

9.2 FOTA Upgrade

Use the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) Upgrade tool to update your device's software. To access **Updates**, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Updates** or touch **Settings>System vpdates**.

Touch () and the device will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, touch the () button, and when that's finished, touch () to complete the upgrade. Now your device will have the latest version of the software. You should turn on data connection or Wi-Fi before searching for updates. Settings for autocheck frequency are also available once you restart the device. If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, a dialog will pop up to choose download or ignore, the notification will also appear in status bar.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

2 Troubleshooting

My device has not responded for several minutes

- If your device doesn't respond, turn off your device by pressing and holding the Power key until it turns off and then restart it again.
- If your device has a removable battery, remove the battery and reinsert it, then
 restart the device.

My device turns off by itself

- When your device turns off by itself, make sure that the Power key is not accidentally pressed.
- · Check the battery charge level.
- · Check your device's settings for turning off the device at a certain time.
- If it still doesn't work, Factory reset the device via the Backup & reset in the device's Settings. Make sure you have backed up your data.

My device can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the proper charger that comes with the device.

I can't download new files

- Make sure that there is sufficient device storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier.

The device can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- · Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your device is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two devices are within Bluetooth's detection range.

The battery drains too fast

- Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 135 minutes).
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- · Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.

(1) The original battery has undergone rigorous safety inspections to meet qualification standards, the use of non-original batteries may be dangerous.
